

Your Guide for Contacting Your Insurance

Getting an accurate quote of benefits for nutrition counseling can be challenging and misquotes are common. Our nutrition office attempts to get a quote from your insurance before our first visit, but some insurance companies do not offer this service to providers. If you need to call your insurance for a quote, it can be complicated, but here's how it works.

Your insurance company will determine their coverage for nutrition services based on the **combination** of both the **procedure** being performed and the **diagnosis**. We often find that more than one diagnosis and procedure code will apply for our services. When this is the case, our nutrition office will bill for the diagnosis and procedure combination with the best coverage under your insurance as long as it accurately describes our services.

Grandfathered Plans May Not Provide Preventive Benefits

Certain health plans written before the passage of the Affordable Care Act in 2010 are "Grandfathered". A "grandfathered" plan does **not** need to provide any benefits for nutrition counseling under this law. If the plan is not "grandfathered", it must provide services under preventive care benefits even when the plan is self-funded.

Calling Your Insurance Company:

Find the customer service phone number on the back of your insurance card. The customer service representative will ask for your identification number and date of birth.

The table below can help you find the diagnosis and procedure code combinations and coverage laws that apply to your situation.

Make a Detailed Record of Your Insurance Quote:

Use the following table to record the answers to each of the questions for each diagnosis /procedure combination that applies to your situation. Be sure to provide this written summary to our staff on your first visit to assure that our billing personnel can help you get the best coverage.

Networks: If your insurance is Blue Cross, Aetna, EBMS, or Cigna, we are IN-NETWORK. Otherwise, be sure to have the representative quotes Out-of-network rates.
